

One Syllable Words with Vowel Sound OUL

The /oul/ sound is spelled three ways in the OnTrack Reading curriculum and is taught immediately after the /oo/ sound because of the overlaps of the “oo” and “u” spellings. Of the three spellings of this sound, only the “oul” spelling is not being used to represent another vowel sound, so it was chosen, and this curriculum refers to the /oul/ sound.

The words in the list below start with basic code consonant spellings, then progress to more complex consonant spellings. The words marked with an asterisk (*) contain consonant spellings that are not taught explicitly in the OnTrack Reading curriculum. Words with a double asterisk (**) contain very rare spellings of a sound.
